Maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible

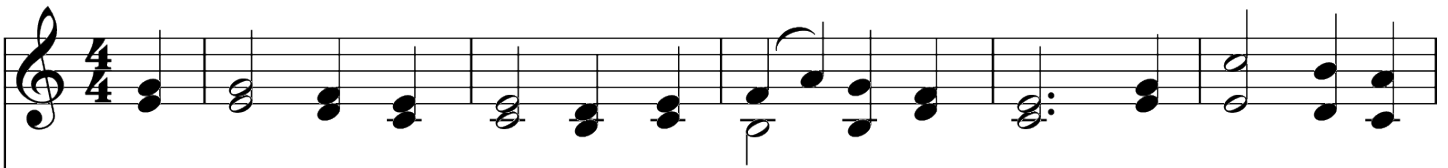
And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only begotten Son of God,
